

Maintenance Committee Report

- Geotechnical engineers have been hired to develop a structural plan, which uses a naturalistic approach, to address the significant lake bank erosion issues along common lake banks within the Community.
- Since mature palm trees are dying due to increased lightning strikes, the Maintenance Committee is developing



- Bicycle racks will be installed at Clicker Beach and Mariner Drive
- Two additional benches have been installed: One in Playa del Sur on Calle del Sur and one in Granada Estates on Granada

Drive.

- The interior of each gate house is receiving basic renovation.
- A new pump and filtration motor will be installed in the main circle fountain.



- The perimeter fencing round the Community is being repaired and upgraded.
- Invasive vine and plant clearing continues along the lake banks and designated conservation areas.

Security and Emergency Response (SER) Committee Report

The Committee would like to update you regarding community security in light of two homes in the Granada Estates Neighborhood being entered and vandalized in September. Areas of the

homes were ransacked and items were taken, and it appears the perpetrators traveled by foot and exited the community via one of the beach walkovers.

As you know, the Association recently completed installation of video security monitoring cameras at all gates. Also, access control per-



sonnel have begun documenting the drivers licenses of all visitors and vendors prior to issuing computerized passes and granting access to Hammock

Dunes. Another recent change is that multi-day passes are no longer issued.

Besides vehicular access control, the other main function of Securitas personnel is roving patrol surveillance. A rover routinely travels throughout the community and reports suspicious activity he witnesses to the Sheriff's Office. Securitas personnel are not licensed law enforcement officers nor do they provide any security or emergency services. Due to the overall size of Hammock Dunes and unrestricted access in areas such as the beach and waterways, it is impossible to keep all unauthorized individuals from entering our community. Also, of course, it is possible that rovers will not happen upon illegal activity while it is in progress.

The Association continues to work closely with the Sheriff's Office in an on-going effort to enhance community security and apprehend the criminals. **All residents are again urged to**



routinely secure their homes and vehicles and to look out for their neighbors. Suspicious activity should be immediately reported to the Flagler County

Sheriff's Office by calling 911.

Heightened awareness and vigilance on the part of all residents will greatly assist our efforts to keep our residences secure and our families safe.

Other items of interest from the SER Committee include:

- Proposals to install gates at the four common dune walkovers are being reviewed.
- Proposals to add curbing between the ingress and egress lanes to the Granada Estates (north) gate are being solicited.

- Additional signage has been added at open access locations indicating private property and that trespassers will be prosecuted.
- A Flagler County deputy sheriff attended the October 19 HDOA meeting and discussed home security and patrolling of the public property adjacent to Hammock Dunes.

• Residents are reminded to enter their authorized visitor information on the GateSure website, which is accessible by clicking on the "Gate Access Login" link that appears on the Association's Web site

(www.hammockdunesoa.com). Although online entry of this information is preferred, you can instead submit a new 2009 "Vehicular Access Information" (VAI) card, which is available at the gatehouses or at the Association's Web site under the "Forms/Other Information" link. It is very important that you update your visitor information immediately in one of these two ways, since all old VAI cards are scheduled to be destroyed soon.

As the busy season approaches here at Hammock Dunes, it is a good time to assess your


property's "autumn cleaning" needs for meeting community standards. Chores to consider include roof and driveway pressure cleaning, house paint touch-up, mailbox repair
